Module Aims

This module aims to develop an understanding of the decision making process in context of policing. Students will analyse decision making models of policing (E.g. National Police Decision Making Model and THRIVE). Additionally students will gain an understanding of a range of decision making models from the Naturalistic Decision Making paradigm and their application to the context of policing. Students will evaluate approaches to decision making and critically explore decision making processes in routine and non-routine situations and the impact on decision making. Through reflection on situational context student officers will evaluate their own decision making process.

Assessment 1: Reflective Portfolio (4,000 words)

Linking theory to practice and vice versa the student will identify and examine an element of professional practice within the applied setting of policing. Applying the concept of reflective practice the student will reflect on a routine or non-routine situation. Students will demonstrate an understanding of Police Decision Making Models. The portfolio will provide evidence of the development of the students' (Special Constable) knowledge and understanding in relation to the identified theme. The portfolio will demonstrate how the student has used reflective practice and approaches to decision making to enhance and inform future professional working practice.
