5	Report on, and present research findings using approaches appropriate for the methodological approach adopted.

7	Reflect on the conclusions reached; identify strength and weaknesses in the research process and the potential that exists for future research in the chosen area.

Indicative Assessment Tasks:

The undergraduate research project involves completing an original piece of research and reporting on the findings, the proposal having already been completed as part of the L5 Research Module. The Final project will include

- i) Literature Review 1,500 words
- ii) Summary of Methodology and methods actually used: 1,500 words
- iii) Findings section 1,500 words
- iv) Discussion and conclusion 1,500 words
- v) Appendices e.g. questionnaire, interview schedule, consent forms
