Learning and Teaching Strategies:

Practice Placement under the supervision of a qualified social worker. University support systems are mediated by personal tutor support.

Syllabus outline:

100 day placement where hours are typically 9am – 5pm, working approximately 37 hours per week (according to agency patterns) to meet the regulatory requirements set by the Care Council for Wales (Social Care Wales) for placement opportunities.
