Module aims

The module aims to provide students with an opportunity to define their own focus of study within the parameters of an academic discipline relevant to social welfare. For example contemporary social issues such as poverty and inequality, child welfare, mental health, migration, aging etc.

Module Learning Outcomes - at the end of this module, students will be able to:

1	Identify and analyse a chosen topic relevant to social welfare.
2	Systematically gather, collate, analyse and synthesise material from a wide range of sources relevant to the chosen topic.
3	Demonstrate skills relating to the organisation and communication of complex ideas in a clear and effective manner.
4	Integrate complex ideas and empirical findings, extrapolating and applying higher level knowledge within social welfare.

Assessment

Indicative Assessment Tasks:

The submission of a negotiated learning project which includes a learning agreement:

The student will identify a chosen topic relevant to social welfare. Formulate an agreement identifying learning goals/objectives and the strategies and resources by which these goals can be met. Identify how it will be assessed and the time scale for completion. Present evidence to show that these objectives have been achieved. Indicative word count -3,000 words.

Learning and Teaching Strategies

Students will be required to submit a title, plan and reading list in relation to their intentions and this will be discussed by the social work team before the student proceeds with their study. Thereafter, the negotiated learning module will be supported by individual tutorials with an identified member of staff with relevant expertise in the specialist area identified. Students will be encouraged to work independently. Support will be provided in weekly online synchronous meetings or face to face meetings depending on the preferences of the student concerned.
