Assessment:

- 1. Students will analyse the funding environment for their own sector and identify potential sources of future funding. Students will source one bid/tender document relevant to their situation, justify an organisational decision to bid for the funds and identify the information required to fulfil the requirements of the bid process. This will include a negotiated learning task one element of the bid document will be completed in full and submitted for appraisal by the tutor.
- 2. Students will assess own organisation's readiness to apply for funding (use of case study available if required) and present a portfolio of organisational evidence based on the checklist undertaken on the course. Students will demonstrate how their own organisation (or through using a case study) is prepared to enter the tendering/bidding process and will identify appropriate funding sources which are relevant to their own work situation
