Assessment:

- Practical students will undertake a range of assessed practical tasks. They will explain
 their reasons for choices / fitting of tack and equipment, they will select and discuss use of
 farriery tools, they will demonstrate clipping, trimming and pulling manes / tails and will
 undertake lungeing. For higher grades correct practical procedures, together underpinning
 theoretical understanding and industrial efficiency will be demonstrated.
- 2. **In-class test** the test will incorporate multiple choice and short answer questions.

Learning and Teaching Strategies:

This module will build on Stable Management 1. It will be taught through a combination of lectures, seminars, practical delivery, and student activity. A key feature of the module is the opportunity for students to apply theoretical learning to practical application. Students will have the opportunity to undertake practical work at the Northop campus equestrian yard, and will undertake educational visits to broaden their knowledge of equestrian skills applied within the industry.

Syllabus outline:

Be able to work safely and efficiently.

Fit and evaluate tack and equipment for the competition horse

- Select and fit tack / training aids and equipment for different competitions
- Understand the action of various bits
- Fit a double bridle and know the action and when to use one
- Select and put on exercise / schooling boots / schooling bandages and understand their use

The principles of shoeing, clipping and trimming horses

• Know the shoeing procedure and correctly identify farrier tools and their uses



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- Know the procedure for removing a shoe in an emergency situation
- Understand why to clip and relevant welfare issues
- Know how to assemble and care for clippers
- Demonstrate correct clipping, pulling manes or tails, trimming
- Be able to plait the mane / tail with elastic bands / thread.

Lunge / long-rein a horse for exercise and to improve way of going

- Select and fit lunge / long rein equipment / training aids
- Know the benefits / risks of lungeing / long reining
- Demonstrate correct lungeing / long reining for exercise and to improve way of going
