Module aims

This module aims to equip students with key study and employability skills. It aims to support students to identify existing skills, attitudes and attributes and to plan how these can be improved and developed to enhance their learning journey and career outcomes. Students will be guided to understand and develop key academic skills, including being critical and acknowledging the viewpoints of others and the use of technology to support academic achievement and future employment.

Module Learning Outcomes - at the end of this module, students will be able to:

1	Identify current skills, attitudes and attributes in relation to study and employment and plan for further development to enhance academic and career goals.
2	Develop academic writing conventions including the use of citation and Harvard referencing.
3	Identify and develop independent learning skills including the use of technology as a means to support academic study and future employment.
4	Examine the role of criticality in academic writing and how to represent the views of others.

Assessment

Indicative Assessment Tasks:

1 Coursework – Based on an assessment of current skills, attributes and attitudes students should produce a plan outlining the learning and employability skills they intend to develop over the duration of their studies. The plan should detail specific aims and actions and demonstrate a commitment to personal development.

2 Written Assignment– Students should plan, draft and write a 1,500 word piece of writing on a theme of their choice demonstrating accurate use of academic conventions.
