Assessment:

Assessment One:

The written assessment for this module will focus on observed sessions with patients at level 6, followed by the submission of 3 in depth case studies one of each modality: aromatherapy, reflexology and massage.

Assessment Two:

A practical exam to be undertaken towards the end of Trimester 2. Students must demonstrate safety and competence of treatment protocols with clear rationales for the use of techniques applied.

Assessment Three:

Students must achieve a minimum of clinical 150 hours at level six to pass this element of assessment.

The module will be taught through a combination of practical sessions, peer and group supervision, peer evaluation, action learning and reflective journals. The practical sessions will involve the application of skills for each discipline within a working clinic environment.
