## **Assessment:**

### **Assessment One:**

The written assessment for this module will focus on observed sessions with patients at level 6, followed by the submission of 3 case studies one of each modality: aromatherapy, reflexology and massage.

### **Assessment Two:**

A practical exam to be undertaken towards the end of Trimester 2. Students must demonstrate safety and competence of treatment protocols with clear rationales for the use of techniques applied.

#### **Assessment Three:**

Students must achieve a minimum of 150 clinical hours at Level six to pass this element of assessment.
