Module Aims:

The module aims to foster an understanding of common mental health disorders and their presentation in practice with particular reference to general / medical and acute settings. It further aims to develop the integration of knowledge and practice in relation to providing

holistic, individualised care based on the principles of the nursing process within a multiagency arena.

Intended Learning Outcomes:

At the end of this module, students should be able to ...

- 1. Identify the diagnostic criteria for a range of mental health conditions and discuss their presentation in healthcare settings
- 2. Critically discuss a range of theoretical paradigms in relation to the societal perspectives of mental illness and their influence on relevant social policy and health interventions
- 3. Select and apply appropriate interpersonal interventions which may enhance the care of the client with a mental health condition, co-morbid to a physical illness
- 4. Identify pathophysiology which may negatively impact on a person's mental health

Assessment:

Learners will be expected to conduct a simulated assessment interview of a person with a mental health condition requiring care for a physical co-morbidity. Learners will also produce a reflection on their own views of mental illness with reference to theories of mental illness, both contemporary and historical.
