The module will be delivered using a range of methods appropriate to the specific Humanities disciplines.

These will include lectures, seminars, tutorials and presentations, fieldwork and practical sessions.

Syllabus outline:

The syllabus will include material from across the subject areas of English, History, Creative Writing and Theatre and will include:

English: study and analyse examples of poetry and narrative

Writing: opportunities to produce creative writing in a variety of forms and genres

History: approaches to the study of themes in social and cultural history

Theatre: Approaches to acting methods and styles of theatre.
