Module Aims:

This module aims to:

- Develop skills of close reading, analysis and discussion of appropriate genre texts from a writer's perspective
- Practise and develop skills of historical fiction writing in accordance with established conventions

- 3. Produce a sustained piece of literature in the historical genre, demonstrating the technical skills necessary to the selection, planning, drafting and writing the finished piece (KS1, KS4, KS6)
- 4. Critically reflect on and improve their own creative practice (KS5)
