Assessment:

Assessment is summative by means of an examination. Students will be asked to answer an unseen paper lasting 2 hours that consists of 5 case studies. The students must select to answer 3 out of the 5 triage case studies. Each case study will involve assessing the patients' problems and devising a plan of care. The student will demonstrate evidence based, rationale decision making and an in-depth understanding of prioritising care, navigating referral to services, and legal and ethical frameworks.

Learning and Teaching Strategies:

The module will be delivered through a mixture of lectures, tutorials and directed private study. Students will discuss and share ideas through student led seminars, chat rooms, peer group discussion and practical exercises. There will be an element of shadowing healthcare professionals in practice in order to observe triage systems.

Syllabus outline:

The nature of triage in primary care, decision making, legal and ethical frameworks, protocols and assessment tools, history taking, documentation, communication skills, clinical governance and quality, audit, referral systems, risk management, case histories, red flags, managing difficult consultations, team working.
