Assessment:

Produce a dissertation as follows:

(i) A 15,000 to 20,000 word theoretical analysis: The analysis must be both critical and reflective, evaluating a substantive area of the relevant literature. The student's theoretical position must be both well articulated and subject to reflective critique.

Or

A 15,000 to 20,000 word report of a small scale research project or audit. The (ii) selected method may deploy a quantitative or qualitative design.
