Module aims

This module is designed to allow students who have no previous experience in the Welsh language to learn linguistic skills that can be adopted in a professional bilingual working environment. The focus is on developing confidence in the Welsh language to utilise in the workplace at an access level. The emphasis of the module is on conversing in Welsh, including discussing personal details, simple greetings and terminology connected to the workplace. Students will also be introduced to Welsh legislation, national standards and Welsh culture.

Module Learning Outcomes - at the end of this module, students will be able to:

1	Demonstrate an awareness of Welsh culture through the basic understanding and practical application of Welsh greetings, dates, times, numbers and the Welsh alphabet.
2	Converse through simple face-to face Welsh exchanges.
3	Illustrate an understanding of job titles and terminology through the medium of Welsh in line with industry and Welsh language strategies impacting on work disciplines.

Assessment

Indicative Assessment Tasks:

Assessment for this module comprises one practical assessment and one written piece of coursework:

Assessment 1: Oral presentations based on a series of dialogues – these dialogues will be presented individually, in pairs and in groups. Students will be assessed individually on their delivery within the pair work, the dialogues will be 20 minutes in length.

Assessment 2: Students will present worksheets based on their line of work and basic Welsh to English translation as well as an outline of their awareness of Welsh culture and strategies.
